

Richmond SAR Honors 5th U.S. President James Monroe at Hollywood Cemetery Annual Ceremony Refurbished "Birdcage" Sarcophagus Revealed After 18 Months and \$1 Million Restoration.

The U.S. Army Command at Ft. Lee, VA, who represented the President of the United States, also the *James Monroe Foundation*, guests from VASSAR, the Richmond SAR and others, celebrated the first public viewing of James Monroe's restored resting place April 28. Once painted black, Monroe's famed "birdcage" sarcophagus now has its original "buff" color consistent with the President's Richmond reinternment date in 1859. 



New Rev War Headstones Placed at Shockoe Hill Cemetery

New headstones identifying the final resting place of eight Revolutionary War veterans were unveiled at a ceremony hosted by *Friends of Shockoe Hill Cemetery* in Richmond June 4. Helping to officiate were Richmond SAR Compatriots Taylor Cowardin, a past Chapter President, and Josh Wilberger. Chapter President Dennis C. Peterson placed a wreath at three of the gravesites with Jeffrey Burden, a long time officer with the cemetery preservation organization. Mr. Burden estimates a dozen more Revolutionary War gravesites have been researched and identified and are yet to be properly marked. The VASSAR Color Guard presented the Colors as part of the ceremony.

Blandford Cemetery Site Refurbished

The flag installed by the Richmond SAR a year ago at Blandford Cemetery in Petersburg was replaced April 27 when Chapter members visited for landscape and site maintenance. The new flag was donated by 2nd VP Robert Halpern who joined Compatriots Bill Akers, Lowell Flickinger, George Corbett and Beau Robertson for raking and mulching duties. THIS MONTH IN THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION

This fascinating tour of events important to the cause of the American Revolution is a regular feature of our Richmond SAR meetings. In April Chapter Surgeon Hal Raddin recounted the surrender of Richmond to British General Benedict Arnold. Without a shot.

Arnold, an American General before turning traitor has "his place in Richmond Revolutionary War history forever cemented. The antipathy of this American community rightly deserved," Raddin reported.

In May, Compatriot Stephen Mick reminded that not every engagement was successful for the Americans. The Thomas Creek Massacre of May 17, 1777 was a failed attempt by American forces to invade East Florida. Loyalists and Indians took up arms to defeat the small band of Georgia Revolutionary War militiamen.

At our June luncheon, Dr. Raddin told the story behind Patrick Henry's "Virginia Resolves" which gave history his second most famous quotation, "If this be treason, make the most of it." Page~15

Edward W. Truslow passed away June 1, 2017. He was the 96th President of the Virginia Society Sons of the American Revolution. His term was from February 2016 until February 2017. Prior to his service as a VASSAR officer, Ed was a President of the Williamsburg SAR.

He was a good friend to the Richmond SAR. He last spoke to our members at our March 2016 luncheon. The following April he asked the Richmond Chapter to conduct the dedication ceremony for the installation of a new stone memorial honoring Revolutionary War soldiers interred at Petersburg's Blandford Cemetery. It was one of his "Presidential Initiatives." Another was raising funds for the American Revolution Museum at Yorktown, a great legacy all VASSAR members should be proud of.

A memorial service for Ed Truslow was held at Bruton Parish Church in Colonial Williamsburg on June 17, 2017.

William Allen Thurman, Jr., MD died March 6, 2017 after a prolonged illness. His membership in the Richmond SAR was remembered by his family at his passing along with other lineage organizations such as the Military Order of the Stars and Bars.

Dr. Thurman practiced radiology at Richmond Memorial Hospital. He had a lively interest in history and genealogical research. He was buried alongside his paternal grandparents, Dr. Allan Thurman and Mrs. Frances Thurman, in Oakwood Cemetery in Bedford, VA.

In lieu of flowers his family suggested a contribution in his honor to the Virginia Historical Society in Richmond.
