On a sweltering July 4th morning over 50 SAR Compatriots from around Virginia celebrated the life of Commander In Chief of the Continental Army and 1st President of the United States George Washington. It was the 56th Annual Independence Day March to Washington's Tomb organized and hosted again in 2017 by the George Washington Chapter of VASSAR. Thousands of Mt. Vernon visitors, along with SAR family and friends, watched the parade and viewed a wreath laying at the President's tomb after the gate was opened, a rare occurrence. Richmond Chapter President Dennis C. Peterson made the march past the Mt. Vernon mansion and paid respects at the tomb of President Washington and our first First Lady Martha Washington.



Remembering.....

Lemuel Wilmer "Chip" Houston Jr. Lt. Col. USMC-R (Ret) of Chesterfield County, VA died July 9, 2017. He was a former Member of the National Society Sons of the American Revolution (NSSAR).

Chip Houston was commissioned 2nd Lt. in the USMC in 1961 following graduation from Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University. After active duty service he remained in the USMC Reserves where he retired as a Lt. Col. in 1982. He made his civilian career in the trucking industry retiring as Executive Vice President of Operations of his company and then retiring from corporate life in 1982, according to his published obituary.

Our former Compatriot devoted many of his retirement years to public speaking while active in the American Legion, the VFW and the Marine League in Richmond among other organizations and causes.
