

## Richmond In Running As Host City

Virginia has won the competition to host NSSAR's Annual Congress in 2020. As of mid-September the host city has yet to be determined although Mark Brennan, NSSAR Vice President General, told VASSAR. leaders meeting in Williamsburg that Richmond and Norfolk appear to be the finalists under consideration. Brennan is a former Richmond Chapter President who continues to serve on our Board of Managers. Williamsburg was the last Virginia city to host a NSSAR Annual Congress in 2007.












