

Letter from Eric Helms Monday, Chancellor, VASSAR

I am delighted that yesterday's resolution of the budget impasse has resulted in our new and improved War Graves Legislation. This legislation becomes State law July 1 and thereafter provides for an additional \$23,100 yearly funding. This is almost <u>ten times</u> the previous appropriated amount. State law now specifies our Virginia Society SAR as manager of these funds. Previously we merely operated under a "memorandum of understanding" with VDHR. There is little to fear (barring a truly catastrophic financial situation for the State) that the appropriation will not be automatically included in future budgets.

As we approach the 250th anniversary of the Revolution, we should rejoice that Virginia has now at long last recognized essentially <u>all</u> (that we've identified) of the men and women, including people of color, who served the Glorious Cause from the Commonwealth. I believe <u>Virginia now has the most extensive program of Revolutionary War Graves recognition in the entire nation.</u> As we took the lead in the Revolution, it is entirely appropriate that we now lead in commemorating it.

For this we should be especially grateful to Mike Lyman and his team. Without their tirelessly heroic efforts documenting these graves, this legislation could not even be *contemplated*—much less achieved.

We should also be most thankful to Delegate Greg Habeeb (R-Salem) and Senator Bill Stanley (R-Moneta), who carried this legislation through their respective chambers, and even more importantly—saw to it that the money stayed in the state budget. I hope we will appropriately recognize their exemplary service on our behalf.
