The Annual James Monroe birthdate commemorations at Hollywood Cemetery and at his Westmoreland County birth site have been cancelled this year. Similar commemorations at James Madison's Montpelier and Thomas Jefferson's Monticello were also called off. Re-enactors observing Benedict Arnold's raid on Richmond from Westover Plantation and at Historic St. John's Church barely got their programs in before the prohibition of public meetings.



Today is the 245th anniversary of Patrick Henry's "Liberty or Death" speech.



My fellow amazing coworkers could not let this momentous anniversary go unnoticed. They worked hard to create our first-ever virtual "Liberty or Death" reenactment.

We hope this video will be a source of education and entertainment for all those working from home and a great history lesson for children who are out of school.

And, while March 23rd is all about Mr. Henry's "Liberty or Death" speech staff and I are drawing strength from another one of his speeches. In 1799 Mr. Henry gave his last public speech at Charlotte Court House, Virginia in which he spoke against the Kentucky and Virginia Resolves. At that time the newly formed United States were in danger of falling apart. And once again, Mr. Henry using his incredible gifts gave a speech that brought people together.



He said, "United we, divided we fall. Let us not split into factions which must destroy that union upon which our existence hangs."

While we weather this storm, we sincerely appreciate the encouragement from everyone in the St. John's Church Foundation family.

Remembering Our Friend Jim Robeson 1938 - 2020

We lost our good friend Jim Robeson on February 20, 2020. He was a Past President of our Chapter but mostly the best ambassador the Sons of the American Revolution could have. The rolls of our Chapter are filled with members whose first introduction to our fraternal organization was made by Jim Robeson. Between himself and his late wife Fran, a Past DAR Regent, it would be hard to find a more passionate couple over the SAR mission.

Jim was a retired LCDR in the U.S.N.R. but he was especially proud of his Merchant Marine service after graduating from the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy in 1961, which required a Congressional appointment for acceptance. He was instrumental in securing permanent recognition at Virginia's War Memorial for this State's Merchant Seaman lost in WWII.

Although his service as SAR Chapter President was about 10 years ago, Jim rarely missed a meeting or event organized by his Chapter. He was passionate about researching his family history to the end.

Jim Robeson was buried next to his wife at Richmond's Hollywood Cemetery.

Attached to their headstone are the SAR and DAR emblems. May they rest in peace.
