

Ceremonies at Yorktown Cancelled for Oct. 2020

VASSAR Secretary Wayne Rouse sent us the following memo announcing another casualty of the COVID-19 pandemic.



"The Yorktown Day Dinner and reception luncheon have been cancelled. The Yorktown Day Parade has been cancelled. The French Wreath laying ceremonies at the cemetery and memorial will be conducted with minimal attendance. The Yorktown Day Patriotic wreath laying ceremony at the monument will be conducted with minimal attendance; program details have yet to be determined.

In addition to the above, the Virginia SAR will be making a determination whether or not a ceremony will be held at Grace Church for the purposes of honoring Gov. Thomas Nelson. Information will be forthcoming."

The Richmond SAR has been a participant in the annual Yorktown victory commemoration ceremonies for many years.



Remembering Our Compatriot and Friend

Rod Brown

1923 - 2020

The Richmond Chapter lost one of its most dedicated and illustrious, long-term members last month on June 13, 2020. We had been SAR Compatriots and friends for decades.

Roderick Dew Brown joined the SAR as a descendant of Judge Benjamin Waller, the law teacher of George Wythe. In his youth he became an Eagle Scout and as an adult he actively supported the SAR scouting programs. He served on active duty as an officer in the U.S. Army.

Rod and wife Pat moved to Richmond where he joined the SAR and accumulated an impressive list of accomplishments:

Richmond Chapter President twice in 1975 1991; VASSAR President 1980-1981;

Vice President General for NSSAR of the Mid-Atlantic States;

Chairman of the Yorktown Committee where he helped organize the Yorktown Bicentennial Celebration, which was attended by President Reagan;

Member of the Jamestown Society;

Member and Governor of the Society of Colonial Wars;

Former member of the Sons of the Revolution;
Awarded the Gold Good Citizenship Award

Rod retired from Blue Cross and Blue Shield. He was an active member of the SAR for fifty years and was a pillar of our organization. He will be sorely missed.





Did you know.....

- Three U.S. presidents, George Washington, James Monroe, and Andrew Jackson, actually served during the Revolutionary War.
- Six U.S. presidents were real sons of Revolutionary War patriots. These men included John Quincy Adams, Martin Van Buren, William Henry Harrison, John Tyler, Zachary Taylor, and Franklin Pierce.
- Five U.S. presidents were the grandsons of Revolutionary War patriots, including James Knox Polk, Millard Fillmore, Abraham Lincoln, Chester A. Arthur, and Grover Cleveland.
- President James A. Garfield was the great-grandson of a Revolutionary War patriot, while President Richard M. Nixon was the great-greatgrandson of a patriot.

There have been sixteen Presidents of the United States who were also SAR members.
