A note of thanks and the path ahead . . .

Upon taking the oath of office, Richmond Chapter President Chris Yohn shared the following:

"I'm incredibly humbled and honored to accept the Presidency of the Richmond Chapter SAR.

"As my first official act, I'd like to formally recognize and express the Chapter's appreciation for President Bill Haskins' leadership.

"Bill took the role during the height of the pandemic and led us through two very difficult years while keeping the chapter steady and strong. And, he did it all while simultaneously serving as the Virginia Society registrar, being responsible for every new member and supplemental application across the state.

"Bill presided over some very signature events during his tenure. Those include a Virginia Society virtual commemoration of Patrick Henry's 'Give me Liberty or give me death' speech from St John's Church. The event featured costumed interpreters reenacting and giving context to the speech.





"Bill also served as host for another Virginia Society event when we dedicated the new Revolutionary Veterans monument in Shockoe Hill Cemetery. The monument was originally scheduled to be dedicated during the 2020 SAR National Congress in Richmond, but was put on hold when the Congress was cancelled. The dedication instead took place in-person the following spring, and honored the more-than-20 patriot ancestors who are laid to rest at Shockoe Hill. Those include Chief Justice John Marshall and 'The Hercules of the Revolution' Peter Francisco.

"Bill was also called on for countless special duties in the past two years, like hosting the Virginia Society annual meetings, traveling to conduct a new member induction for an out-of-state society and many more. In every instance, Bill demonstrated leadership and professionalism and he ceaselessly represented the Richmond Chapter to the highest standard. He's kept our membership growing and the chapter moving forward under difficult circumstances. His ongoing service will be as invaluable as the service he's performed so far. We owe Bill a great debt of appreciation and I'm proud to follow such a magnificent example.

"Moving forward, we're presented with some truly unique opportunities to make a mark for our organization and for our country.

"Locally, we'll celebrate the 100-year anniversary of the Richmond Chapter this coming April. On a larger stage, the 250th anniversary of the Revolution gets well underway as the nation begins to mark the events of 1773, like the British Parliament passing the tea act on May 10 and the Boston Tea Party taking place the following December.



"These are fun and celebratory occasions. We should capitalize on that dynamic to widen our circle and share our message. What fantastic opportunities to invite a neighbor or friends from work, or church. These celebrations and observances are ideal chances to engage the broader public, demystify the SAR and appeal to freedom-loving Americans with patriot ancestors that there's a place for them in the SAR.

"And, while these events WILL be fun, we shouldn't lose sight of their greater significance. Many of us fly a flag, not just on major holidays, but also on Pearl Harbor Day, on D-Day - on 9/11. We do so because those events, whether tragic or triumphant, are all a continuation of the story begun by our forefathers. We do so out of respect for all those who gave everything for the freedom we enjoy.

"While this may be a particularly divisive time in our society, we have a singular opportunity to be a unifying force by sharing a message all Americans can be proud to own and hold dear.

"Freedom, as we know it in America, is unique in the history of the world. Of course, the Greeks and even Vikings had elements of democracy in their societies. The British signed the Magna Carta to establish human rights and others around the world tried to move toward basic human liberation. But, monarchs and despots and societal classes always held the last word.

"Then, something amazing happened. Against all odds, our forefathers stood up to that age-old monolithic oppression. They struggled, they suffered and they <u>won</u>. They shone a light down a new path for all humankind.

"Freedom, as the world now understands it, began in America. Here, a person's race, sex, religion, social level, region, family name, profession or any other variable, doesn't preclude them from success. Here, for the FIRST time in the history of the world, ANYONE can rise to any level of success based purely on talent and self-determination.

"THAT is a gift with celebrating. THAT is a responsibility worth protecting. And, THAT is a cause I'm proud to perpetuate with you.


Tradition

In the mean-time, stay close to the many state-wide SAR events through the virginia-sar.org calendar.


